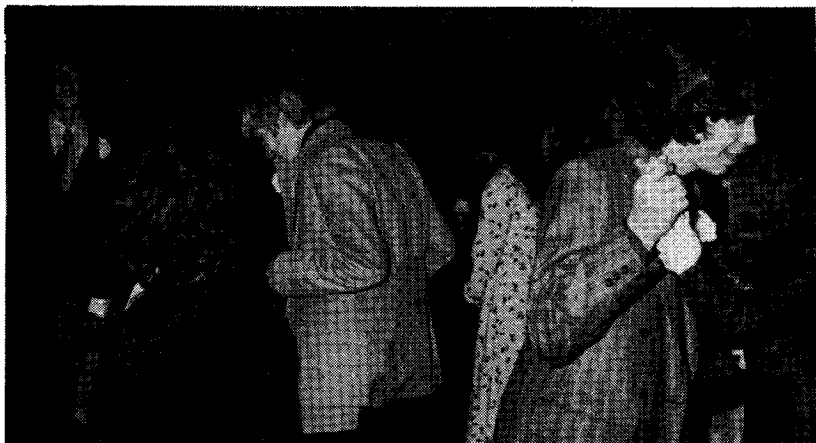

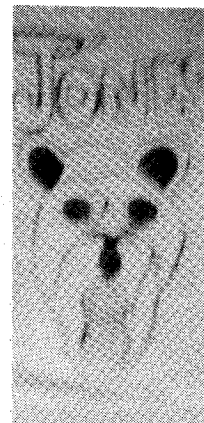

The Choir plans a performance May 24th and is presently practicing for the event.

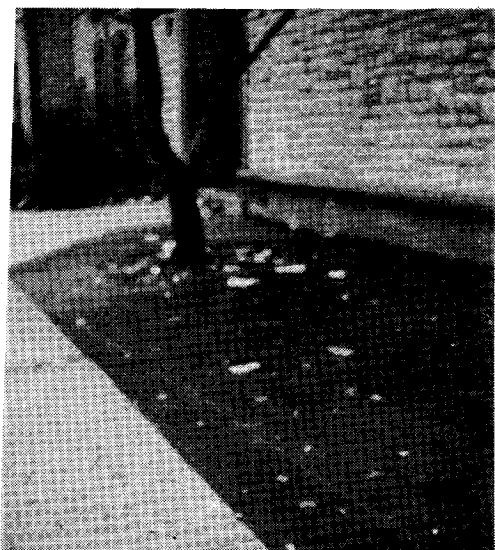
New Dimensions is working on self-improvement, weight control, grooming, and posture.

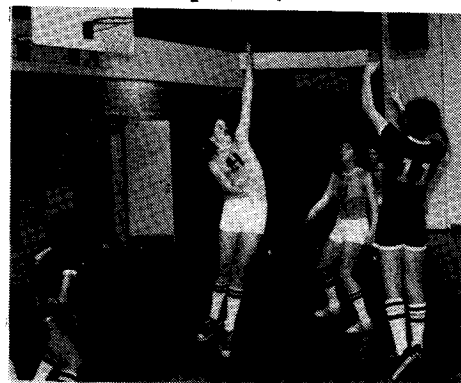

The Jones Varsity Basketball Team ended its season with a 9-5 record. They started out with a loss to Whitehall, 40-35. However, they won nine games straight: Watterson, 54-50; DeSales twice, 52-42 and 41-37; Hastings, 47-31; Worthington, 39-34; St. Charles, 31-26; Reynoldsburg twice, 52-45 and 47-42; and Westerville, 46-35.

Jones was confident of another victory but Hastings made a fantastic comeback in the fourth quarter to beat Jones, 30-27. Charley Dilenschneider, the "big man" for Jones, said, "Our defense stunk and our offense couldn't get going in the fourth quarter." Team manager Kenny Holcomb said that Jones just lost momentum and fouled too much.

Unlike the beginning of the season, Jones carried this loss into the rest of the season by losing other heart-breakers: Blendon, 38-35; Watterson, 54-37 and Worthington, 62-21. Coach Hughes attributed the last 4 losses to low shooting percentages and poor defense. In the game against Worthington, Jones was without four of its starters.

Jones will play Blendon in tournament competition Feb. 15, 5:30 at Jones. Walnut Springs plays Worthington earlier at 4:15 here. The losers will play Friday, Feb. 16 and the winners will play the second game.

The scoring for the season was paced as follows: Charley Dilenschneider-153; Eric Bright-88; Kyle Mercer-107; Joe McElroy-84; Dave Johnson-50; Gary Olix-39;

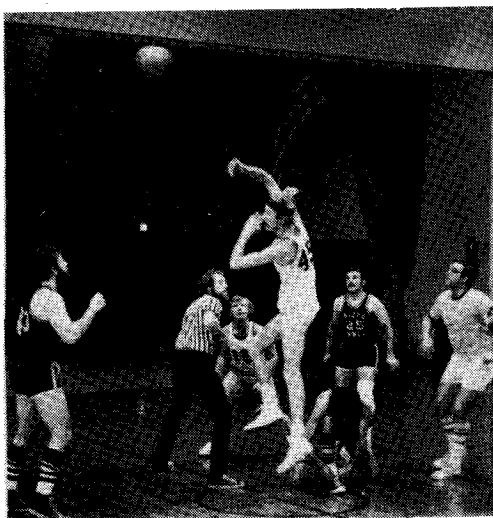

The 8th grade team had a harder time with a 7-3 record, but scrapped just as hard. Coach Crafton said they had a chance to win all their games except one, but the team clutched-up in the last minutes. Wednesday, Feb. 14, the team will go against Walnut Springs in tournament competition.
