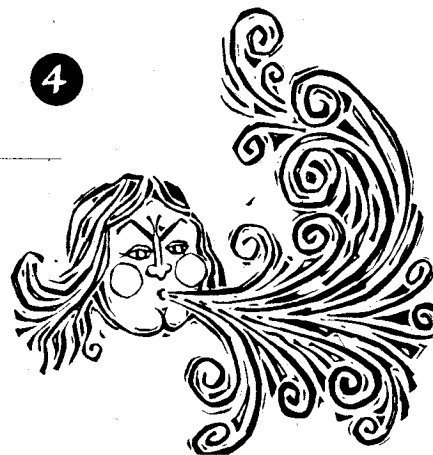

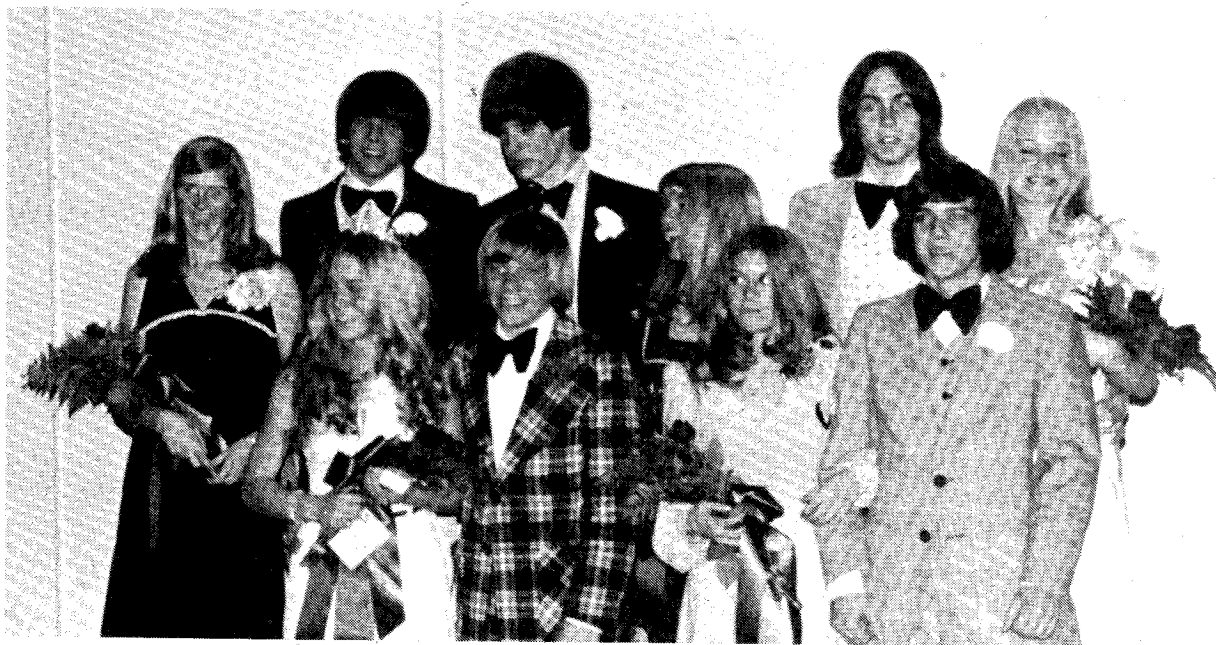

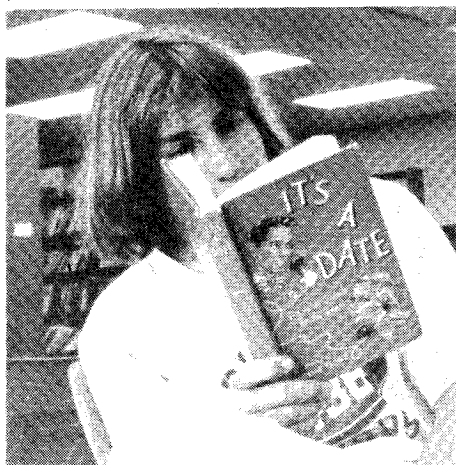
Jones Students Enter

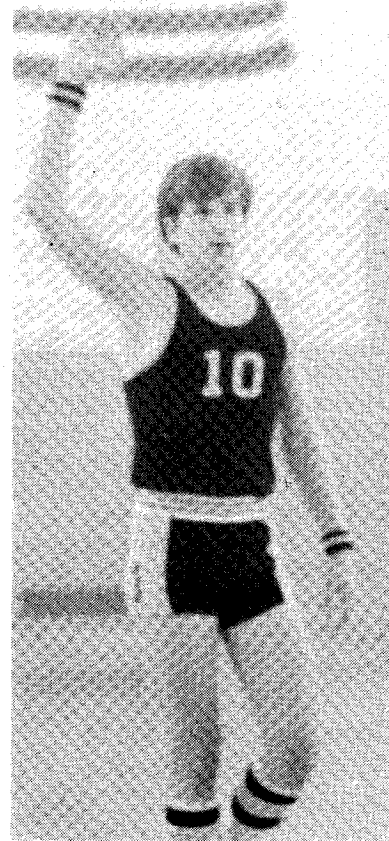


## The Guidance Corner

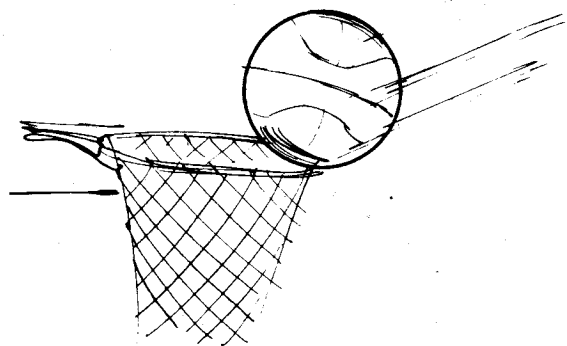

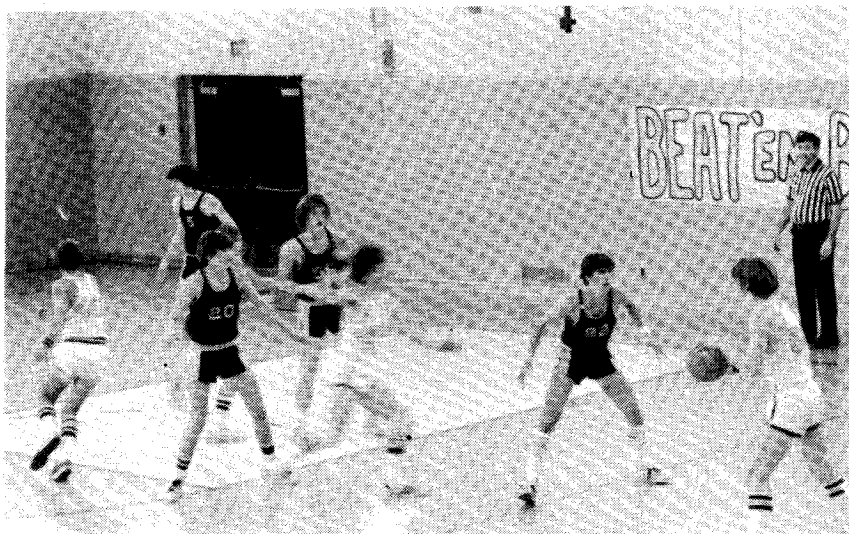
